



Jeff Jahn, B.A.S., R.T. (R) (MR)

Jeff started in MRI when it was still known as NMR shortly after he graduated from the University of Minnesota in 1986. Jeff has extensive experience in the medical imaging industry including expertise as a registered MR technologist, clinical systems and products developer, research coordinator, equipment/technology purchasing, clinical development director, engineering and clinical operations as well as operations and business development.

Currently, he serves as Vice President of Procurement, Facilities and Engineering at Center for Diagnostic Imaging (CDI) / Insight Health Corp, a 125 center medical imaging and image-guided injections provider in 26 states in addition to a fleet of over 110 mobile units serving both coasts and the southern half of the US. In this role, he is responsible for all purchasing activities including all medical imaging equipment and is responsible for clinical applications development. He also oversees the facilities division which manages all site leasing and construction projects nationally. Finally, he directs the in-house engineering department, which while working closely with the OEM, conducts all first-pass service and preventive maintenance on all of the companies imaging equipment nationwide.

Over the years, he has also held the positions of VP Operations and Business Development, Director of Clinical Applications and Imaging Technology, Director Imaging Services, Director Technical Operations. He holds a bachelor's degree in healthcare administration from the University of Minnesota and has been a registered ARRT technologist since 1986.

He has co-authored several publications relating to TMJ imaging in MR and is actively involved in education programs for imaging technologists, both at CDI /Insight and nationally. Over the years he has worked closely with many Medical Device Manufacturing research teams as a study coordinator and technical advisor for MR compatibility projects, as well as orthopedic fixation and fusion device imaging. He is named as the Principle Investigator on several human imaging trails and well as other Phase One clinical research projects.
