Body/Abdominal Imaging Faculty Position

The Department of Radiology at Stanford School of Medicine is searching for a full-time radiologist in Body/Abdominal Imaging. This faculty appointment is open rank in the Medical Center Line, University Tenure Line, or the Clinician Educator Line. The major criteria for appointment for faculty in the Medical Center Line is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care, teaching, scholarly activity that advances clinical medicine, and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. The predominant criteria for appointment for faculty in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching, as well as excellence in clinical care and institutional service appropriate to the programmatic need the individual is expected to fulfill. The major criterion for appointment for Clinician Educators is excellence in the overall mix of clinical care and clinical teaching appropriate to the programmatic need that the individual is expected to fulfill. Faculty rank and line will be determined by the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

Responsibilities of the new faculty will include clinical interpretation of body CT, MRI, ultrasound, and fluoroscopy/plain film exams, participation in the on call service of the Department, education of medical students, residents and body fellows, as well as a significant research/scholarship commitment. The Department of Radiology at Stanford is currently expanding, with significant growth in both the clinical divisions and translational sciences. Exceptional research opportunities exist within the Department, the School of Medicine, and the University which are co-located on the same campus. Research is also facilitated by the recent opening of two new hospitals on the main campus and an active, expanding clinical program featuring several new out-patient imaging centers all with the latest generation equipment.

The successful candidate will have demonstrated exceptional qualities and promise as an outstanding investigator, clinician, and teacher. Candidates should have an MD or MD/PhD degree(s), must be board-certified in diagnostic radiology or equivalent training, have completed a formal fellowship in body imaging or a related sub-specialty, and have shown an outstanding track record of research productivity. Research can include all aspects of body imaging, including clinical, translational, or basic science, as well as computational science and artificial intelligence.
