MRI Radiographer:

An exciting opportunity has arisen for an experienced MR radiographer to take up a permanent full-time post as part of our group of five research MR radiographers who work as part of a bigger team of clinical imaging researchers in Academic Radiology.

The Academic unit of Radiology operates 3 MRI scanners (two whole body GE 1.5T scanners and a whole body Philips 3T scanner) based across two sites at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital and Northern General Hospital in Sheffield. We carry out internationally recognised research in the fields of pulmonary vascular imaging in pulmonary hypertension, lung imaging with the use of hyperpolarised agents as well as neuro research imaging (including functional MR) and in-utero fetal imaging. The unit also performs clinical MRI scans in collaboration with STH NHS Trust.

The successful candidate will work alongside a multidisciplinary team of Consultant radiologists, MR Physicists and engineers and will be expected to support all activities within the MRI unit. You will have significant post-qualification experience in MRI scanning.

Role development within our research groups and contribution to research output is actively encouraged with the opportunity for further academic study.

It is important that you have the ability to acquire and analyse high-quality MR images and are able to make a meaningful contribution to the research work of the team. You should also have a comprehensive and up to date knowledge of MR systems, procedures, safety issues, policies, legislation and quality standards. It is essential that applicants are HPC-registered.

The role generally involves working 35hrs over four days.
